
Are buses and streetcars reliable and predictable? Are they safe? Are they frequent? Are vehicles clean?




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
Ridership and Service Comparisons

2009 2010







Ridership and Service by Area





Conclusions

- RTA's ridership is coming back strongly
- Mid-City, Uptown and New Orleans East achieved most significant growth
- New 40' and Articulated Buses have reduced peak crowding
- Peak standing loads on St. Claude , Tulane, Jackson-Esplanade and other lines
- Standards suggests adjustments needed on Marigny, De Gaulle, Lakeview, Galvez, Thoup.,
