CALL TO ACTION:

Working Together to End Drunk Driving

Louisiana joins the nation in spreading the safety message Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over.



As Mardi Gras parades take place in your area, we encourage you to remind everyone to celebrate responsibly by not getting behind the wheel under the influence of drugs or alcohol. While impaired driving deaths in Louisiana have dropped almost 38% from 375 in 2007 to 234 in 2013, more than 40% of the total fatalities still involve alcohol and/or drugs.

Ways to Help Us Spread the Message:

* Distribute the "Call to Action"

through your Human Resource office or local government office to inform everyone about the campaign taking place from February 17-28, 2017.

* Increase DWI enforcement efforts, and if possible, implement the *No Refusal Policy*.

* Connect with the SHSP Regional Transportation Safety Coalition in your area and join any local initiatives that support this campaign.

February 24-28 (Enforcement Message)

(Enforcement Message: Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over)

It's #MardiGrasLA, so plan ahead! Don't let Fat Tuesday turn into Sorry Wednesday. #DriveSoberLA or designate a driver. A safety reminder from the #DZD Team.

In 2015 during #MardiGrasLA, at least 600 fatal and injury crashes resulted in 11 deaths, 55% of them were alcohol-related. We remind you to #DriveSoberLA!

During #MardiGrasLA 2015, 15% of the 600 fatal and injury crashes involved alcohol. Let's work together to end drunk driving. #DriveSoberLA to reach zero deaths.
