Trainers

Louisiana LTAP employs contract trainers for some classes, while other training is conducted in house. LTAP also conducts team training alongside representatives from DOTD and FHWA. While these trainers may not always be available for your requested session, we will retain your request and notify you when a suitable trainer becomes available to conduct the class. Your interest is important to us, and we're committed to facilitating your training needs as soon as possible.

Course Request Requirements

If your agency is able to meet the following requirements, LTAP would love to schedule a date to hold this *free* class in your facility.

LTAP require no less than 10 people in attendance and no more than 25 in order to deliver this course. Another requirement for this course is to have a classroom or any space that may be used as a teaching space with tables and chairs for participants – we are able to bring a projector, laptop, screen, speakers, etc. for the training. Access to an outdoor space that is close to the classroom in order to conduct an outdoor exercise if necessary (varies by class requested), such as a parking lot or field that we can block off from traffic to protect the safety of our participants.

Most courses are 3.5 hours and typically a 7:30am set-up/registration with class lasting from 8:00am to 11:30am. Times are subject to change based upon the availability of the venue.
